In Botany, students are studying the characteristics of Amaryllis and how to identify the plant. They will be working in the garden with them next week.

Forming compound sentences and learning to distinguish between simple sentences and complex sentences were the sixth graders' focus in language this week. These lessons are designed to help our students avoid fragments and run on sentences in their writing assignments. In Geography they are creating pin maps of South America identifying important features of each country.

AFTER SCHOOL

This week in after school, children have been given ample time in the afternoon to complete their homework. They also enjoyed playing a multitude of games outside. After coming back inside, students were given the option of board games and puzzles of their choice.

PRESCHOOL AFTER SCHOOL Ms. Brewer

This week during circle time, we discussed the meaning of Christmas with the children. The first thing some children said was "we get presents". We discussed that was true but it is not only about Christmas trees and exchanging gifts. It is more than that. It is a time that we get together with our family. We should also think of others whom are less fortunate than us. We sang several Christmas songs but their favorite songs were "Rudolph the Red Nose Reindeer" and "Frosty the Snowman". The children also worked on some Christmas crafts.

Before we went to the playground, the children had a friendly reminder again about the playground rules. Some children sang and danced to "Rocking Around the Christmas Tree" and "Here Comes Santa Claus", while other children were hopping around the playground like Reindeers. Other children were making Christmas trees using sticks. They have a great imagination.

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Dr. Jay Bhattacharya, highly recognized research expert on infectious diseases, questioned the methodology and reported studies contained questionable results that the CDC relied on to create requirements and practices. Dr. Fauci, director of the National Institute of Allergy and Infectious Diseases (NIAID) falsely stated that the covid vaccine gave more immunity than recovering from the disease itself This ridiculous statement was finally reversed to conform to well established medical knowledge. Dr. Fauci went so far as to call himself "the high priest of science" where an attack on him is an "attack on science."

Alex Berenson, an expert on disease research, was originally cancelled from Twitter by pressure from the Biden administration. His statements of the efficiency of various practices to curtail the epidemic was based on scientific studies done worldwide. The woke media would not recognize his expertise and disregarded his statements. He went on the offensive and sued Twitter for being removed from the platform and won. He demonstrated he was not a charlatan or conspiracy theorist but a truth teller.

The covid policies such as staying 6 feet apart, mandated masks, closed gyms, and nationwide church and school closure were found to be unnecessary. Unvaccinated people were removed from their jobs as the vaccine was mandated. These corrupt fiats from our government bureaucracy created false science to sell their political agenda.
